

Town of Smithfield Closes Offices to the Public

The Town of Smithfield Staff continue to work in conjunction with Isle of Wight County Officials to monitor and respond to the COVID-19 outbreak. Following national, state, and local emergency declarations regarding this virus, and out of an abundance of caution, Town offices will be closed to the public beginning on March 18, 2020 until further notice.

- All Town offices, facilities and buildings are closed to the public. This includes Town Hall, the Town Manager's Office (911 South Church Street), the Smithfield Center, the Isle of Wight County Museum, the Manor House at Windsor Castle Park, the Public Restrooms on Main Street, and the Luter Sports Complex.
- The Smithfield Police Department lobby will remain open to the public with limited services.

Other payments may be made via the telephone with exception of HRSD payments, which can be made directly to HRSD. As always, payments may be made at the drop box outside of Town Hall (310 Institute Street). Please call the Treasurer's Office for assistance with other services.
- Most Planning, Zoning & Community Development services may be conducted via telephone and/or email.
- Clontz Park as well as Windsor Castle Park will remain open (with the exception of the Manor House). Visitors to the parks are encouraged to practice "social distancing".
- Town of Smithfield employees will continue to report to work during this time.
